


The purpose of this feature is to provide information for European patent applications within a portfolio and is available to all our clients through the IPRIS web app at no cost. IPRIS does not automatically process European validations for the cases displayed.

The Alert Box

The alerts display the details of any European patent applications within your portfolio that have received an Intention to Grant notification from the EPO and the official date on which it was issued. The alerts will be displayed for nine months from the notification date which corresponds with the estimated deadline for validation.

If you can not see the alert box on your homepage, there are no European patent applications within your portfolio that are in the validation phase.


